Application Deadline: August 10, 2008

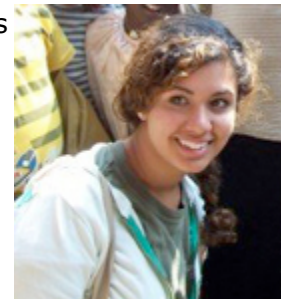
